MAURITIUS CITIZENSHIP ACT

FACT SHEET No. 1

Section 5 – Registration of Commonwealth Citizen

1. Any Commonwealth citizen of **full age** and **capacity** can apply for registration as a citizen of Mauritius under this section.

HOW TO APPLY

2. Application Forms are available at the Citizenship Section of the Prime Minister's Office, Level 4, Government Centre, Port Louis, **Tel Nos** 201-1495; 201-3362; 201-2208 or on the following **website**: pmo.govmu.org; **email**: pmo.citizenship@govmu.org

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

- 3. A declaration in the form set out in the application form has to be subscribed in Mauritius in the presence of a Judge or the Master & Registrar of the Supreme Court or a District Magistrate, prior to submission.
- 4. The following supporting documents in <u>original</u> and <u>two photocopies</u> should accompany the application (clean and legible copies on A4 format):-
- (a) Full/Unabridged birth certificate of applicant (duly apostilled in country of birth);
- (b) Marriage certificate of applicant (if applicable duly apostilled in country of marriage if celebrated abroad);

(Less than 1 year)

- (c) Photocopy of first five pages of applicant's passport (passport valid for at least 6 months);
- (d) Residence permit of applicant in Mauritius (valid for at least 3 months);
- (e) Certificate of character issued by the Director of Public Prosecutions of Mauritius (valid for at least 3 months) and duly apostilled Police clearance / Morality certificate from country of birth / residence; and
- (f) Any other document relevant to the application (e.g. Documents relating to professional background of applicant, investment, economic activities, employment creation, curriculum vitae).
- 5. A non-refundable application fee of **Rs 2,000** should be paid upon submission of the application.
- 6. Upon approval, a **prescribed fee of Rs 50,000 is payable** at the Cash Office of the Prime Minister's Office, Level 2, Government Centre, Port Louis and thereafter the Certificate of Registration is issued within one month.
- 7. If the application is not approved, the applicant will be notified accordingly by way of a letter.

VALIDITY OF A CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION

8. A Certificate of Registration issued under the Mauritius Citizenship Act is valid for an indefinite period and it should be kept safely as **no duplicate** is issued in case of loss.

DEPRIVATION OF CITIZENSHIP

9. Any person who has acquired citizenship by registration may be deprived of that citizenship if the registration has been obtained by means of fraud, false representation or the concealment of any material fact.

NOTE

- All foreign documents should be duly apostilled in country of origin.
- Application shall be made by applicant in person.
- Only a complete dossier with all relevant documents will be accepted.
- An affidavit might be requested if ever there are discrepancies in the names.
- Any other documents deemed necessary, might also be requested by this Office.
- Processing of applications generally requires a minimum of one (1) year.
- No reason will be given for the refusal of any application under the Act.
